
Creating Channels from Contact Forms

AirSend provides you with the ability to use website "Contact Us" forms that are connected to your AirSend account. When a user sends a query using the form, AirSend creates a channel for you and the user where you can respond to the query and communicate.

To insert the contact form into a website:

1. In the upper-right corner of the AirSend screen, click on your username and choose Settings.



The Settings dialog box opens. Settings × Profile Notifications Audio and Video **Contact Form** Account Contact Forms for your website (Beta) Embed a customizable Contact Us form in your website. Messages sent using the form will create a new Airsend channel with your customer, enabling easy and hassle-free communication. Just follow the 2 steps below. 1. 2. Click the Contact Form tab.

- 3. If you want the Contact Us button and form to appear in a different color than the default blue, click Theme color and change it.
- 4. Click Copy script to copy the script that inserts the form into a web page.
- 5. To display a different message on the website after the user clicks send, edit the text in Message to show after submission.
- 6. Click Save.

7. Open the source code for the Web page and insert the script before the end </body> tag.





When the Web page is rendered in a browser, it displays a $\textbf{Contact}\ \textbf{us}$ button:

When a user clicks the button, a Contact us form opens. The user fills in the form and clicks Send.



After the user clicks Send, the text in Message to show after submission appears on the website:



Now, the following happens:


- A channel is created in your AirSend account that includes you and the user who sent the form as members.
- An email is sent to you informing you that the user has responded to the form and the channel has been created.
- An email is sent to the user who sent the form informing them that the channel has been created in AirSend. If the user does not yet have an account in AirSend, they must create one to be able to directly communicate in the channel, but they can send email messages to it.

For example:

Sara Davis has copied the script for the contact form into her website and Jared T has filled out the form and clicked Send.

A channel is created in Sara's account that includes Jared and Sara as members.

The first message in the channel is the message Jared entered in the form.



David receives a message telling him that Denise has filled out a form and a channel has been created where they can communicate.



Hello David M.,

We thought you might like to know that Denise L has filled your form 'Contact Form'.

A channel was created so you can interact with this user and answer their request.
